



CAMPUS POINTS OF INTEREST

Each month we will feature a building or area of campus to showcase the rich history of Auraria, as well as spotlight the many uses of our amazing facilities. This month, we take a look at the Kenneth King Academic and Performing Arts Center (or King Center, as it is commonly known)





The King Center is a vibrant performing arts complex located on the Auraria Campus. The King Center houses six performance spaces; a Concert Hall, Recital Hall, Courtyard Theatre and three permanently assigned production studios dedicated to the education and development of students who wish to study performance arts. The King Center can support many forms and sizes of events, from theatrical performances to large choral ensembles or smaller master classes.

In 2023 the King Center team handled its busiest year since 2019, hosting more than 250 institutional events and over 85 rental events, as well completing multiple maintenance projects from theater rigging inspections to general equipment repair and painting stage floors. Notable events hosted in the King Center include MSU Denver's Viva Southwest Mariachi festival, Global Music Ensembles showcases, MSU Denver's President's Spring and Fall Updates, and the 9 News Denver Mayoral Debate. CCD's theater department presented their highly attended Evil Dead the Musical and MSUD's theater and dance department hosted a two week-long summer workshop Dueling Arts Stage Combat Certification for Actors. UC Denver's Lynx Camp conducted workshops for aspiring music and film students and Auraria's Golda Meir Museum produced the VIP Golda Experience, an exciting event including a reception and conversation with the writer and a one-time screening of the feature film "Golda", directed by Academy Award-winning, Israeli filmmaker, Guy Nattiv.

The King Center also hosted multiple community events through their seasonal rentals to local and regional clients, accommodating a variety of events including graduations, magic shows, comedians, local dance and music studios, as well as a variety of cultural and diversity events serving the Hispanic, Filipino, LGBTQ and many other communities.

The staff at the King Center individually and collectively contribute to the success of each client's events or educational experiences. The team includes John Rivera, Adam Popovich, Priscilla McClain and Hannah Thomas. From excellent customer service to lighting and sound support, their collective knowledge, experience, and dedication ensure a seamless experience.

Recent renovation projects in the King Center include newly refinished stage floors in the Concert and Recital Halls and a facelift of the Eugenia Rawls Courtyard Theater, including a new stage floor, new stage curtains and refresh of the fly system. The costume shop and the design and recording studios have also benefited from recent updates.

Sean Hedgecock is the Director at King Center. Sean came to the King Center after more than a decade of event production work, both in theater and traveling the country producing high profile corporate events. He joined the Auraria team in 2006 as a stagehand, was promoted to the King Center Technical Coordinator in August of 2016 and during a restructuring in May of 2017, Sean was promoted to the King Center Operations Manager, increasing his responsibilities by leading the King Center Advisory Committee and supervising six King Center staff. Most recently, Sean was promoted to the King Center Director!

Sean is a CU Denver Music and Entertainment Industry Studies Graduate with an emphasis in Scoring and Arranging and still enjoys playing music of all kinds.

He is a guitarist and song writer and has recorded many songs over four decades. He currently enjoys collaborating with his bandmates of the Nite Lite Vandals, recording, and publishing new songs on YouTube and Spotify. Sean is an avid carpenter/woodworker and enjoys dreaming up and creating projects made from wood. He is also an amateur artist and is a published illustrator of a children's book.

Sean has worked in the entertainment and production business for over 40 years and has been employed with the Auraria Higher Education Center at the King Center for over 18 years. "My passion for the King Center is to build and sustain an environment where creative minds can flourish." As the acting chair of King Center Advisory Committee, made up of members from the three institutions performing arts departments, Sean collaborates to examine and improve processes in the King Center, sustaining modern and relevant lab spaces for current and future performing arts programs and their students.
